## TO FOSTER AMERICANISM

Foreign Language Newspaper Publishers' Association Formed.

An organization to be known as The Publishers' Association of the American Press in Foreign Languages was formed yesterday at a meeting called by the Inter-Racial Council and attended by delegates representing 175 foreign-lan-guage newspapers. The Honorary Chairman of the organization will be Francis Kellor, secretary of the Executive Committee of the Inter-Racial Group.

Among the objects of the organization are the fostering of unswerving loyalty 10 American ideals and institutions among the readers of newspapers printed in foreign languages; the development of friendly relations between the American press printed in foreign languages and the American press printed in English, and to make such provisions as may be possible for advancing the welfare. interests, standing and influence of loyal
